Miles Community College was the lead awardee, along with Chief Dull Knife College as sub-awardee for projects associated with the retraining of individuals living in Colstrip, MT and surrounding areas impacted by reductions in the coal industry production. Other awardees included Dawson Community College and the Mining and Process Plant Union Training groups. The grant is a federal grant from Labor and Commerce Department and issued/administered via MT Helena Labor and Commerce Department.
  
9. Career and workforce training to assist in a regional need. The grant began in July 2018 and ends in September of 2019. Chief Dull Knife College hosted substance abuse counseling training and environmental technology Training. Miles Community College hosted CDL training in Colstrip and Lame Deer Tribal areas for employees of the mine or process plant. Both colleges also provided general education such as courses or degrees to the mind/process plan employees via online or on campus modalities under the grant.
