These materials include the purchase of specimens for dissection, disposable tools, lab handouts and cleaning supplies. The PSYX100 has undergone a significant retooling this year and innovative hands-on labs have been designed to replace recitations. Students are currently required to purchase a class manual for \$25 and this will be discontinued starting Fall 2011 when the lab fee is scheduled to begin. Thus, our proposal represents a net saving of \$13 for students enrolled in the course.

The meat lab is run under State Meat Inspection standards. Students are required to wear hair nets (\$0.50 each, not re-usable, use roughly 8 per student), lab coats (\$17 each), cutting gloves (\$19 each), belly guards (\$25 each) and knives (\$15-\$25). On top of the individual requirements, there are hand saw blades that are used (\$15), band saw blades (\$35) and cleaning solutions, sanitizers (Clorox and quaternary ammonia, roughly \$25 per semester), foaming cleanser (5 gal \$65, use 5 gal plus in a semester). Meat has to be purchased and harvested for 4 pigs (\$190 purchase price, \$25 per animal harvest fee), 5 sheep (\$120 purchase price with \$50 per animal harvest fee) and 2 to 4 beef (\$1500 purchase price with a \$50 per animal harvest fee, plus transport back to campus). Beef and pork prices have escalated 40% and 45% respectively in the past year. Without this fee, this laboratory will have to cut back on its offerings, thus limiting and reducing the quality of experiences for students.
