## RE: Campus Report for the March 3 - 4 Board of Regents' Meeting

- Miles Community College is completing the final edits on its Year Three Report due in to the Northwest Commission on Colleges and Universities later this spring. The report addresses Standards 1 and 2. In addition, the report lays the groundwork for future reports due for years 5 & 7.
- Jay Wiebers, IT specialist, received the Fall 2011Blue and Silver Award. The Blue and Silver Award is given to one MCC employee each semester and is nominated by Faculty and Staff. The award comes with a parking space and a \$25 check. Congratulations Jay!
- Miles Community College is currently accepting nominations for this year's Hall of Fame inductee. Alumni of Miles Community College who have gone on to represent MCC and themselves in a positive manner are eligible. Nominations are being accepted until April. The induction ceremony will take place at Commencement in May.
- MCC will hold commencement ceremonies on May 12, 2012 at 10:30 a.m. The pinning ceremony for the Nursing program will be held the evening of May11, 2012.
- New Agriculture Instructor Kim Haile was hired on December 13, 2011 and will be
  joining the College faculty on a full-time basis starting January 12, 2012. Kim received
