# Formalization of the Montana University System Developmental Education Council as Continuing Council

In response to Complete College Montana and the Montana University System's focus on student success and completion, the Commissioner is committed to re-designing developmental education through the formalization of the Developmental Education Council. The Developmental Education Council will continue its work as an on-going council of the Montana University System.

The goals of the Developmental Education Council are to accelerate students by reducing the amount of time, number of developmental credits, and number of courses in the developmental sequence so students can be successful in a college level course.

- College Readiness
- Placement and Assessment
- Curricular Redesign
- Student Success and Advising

The System Office will produce reports on the success and completion of students requiring remediation. A consistent framework of metrics will be utilized to produce longitudinal result by campus. Significant progress has already been made (see CCM progress metrics #1 and #2) and further detail with be reported when every CCM outcome and progress metric is disaggregated by remedial status. The Council will be co-chaired by the Deputy Commissioner for Two-Year and Community College Education and the Deputy Commissioner, Academic, Research, & Student Affairs. Council representation will include chief academic officers or designees and faculty representing the comprehensive two-year/community colleges, regional four-year universities, and the two flag-ship universities.

The Council will report annually to the BOR the results of the metrics related to developmental education success and student progression. In addition, the Council is empowered to work with the MUS campuses to implement system level reforms and recommended curricular reforms.

Definition: Percentage of first-time freshmen enrolling in at least one <u>remedial Math</u> course during their first academic year and continuing on to complete a <u>college level Math or Statistics</u> course within two academic years

Remedial Math = basic skills math courses (with course numbers less than 100)

needed for entry into college level math courses

College Level Math = math or statistics courses with course numbers of 100 or higher
