Day	The University Police Department has been approached by leadership at ASUM about a change in parking fees and fine structure. In their view parking is becoming more congested and a rise in fees and changing the fine structure could impact parking in many different ways. Some students are opting not to buy parking permits and still park in the lots, thus cheating the system by taking a chance on receiving a ticket. The way the fine structure is now they can receive 4 tickets and be money ahead in lieu of purchasing a permit. The changes could also influence a reduction of cars driven to Campus and incentivize more green transportation options like Park and rides or carpooling. We purpose a \$40.00 raise in parking permits with a fine structure change. Examples of the fine structure changes are: 1. We would still waive the first ticket. 2. Second ticket for permit parking violation: fail to display a parking permit and the student/staff had a valid permit the fine would be 10.00 a second similar ticket 10.00 but the third would then go to 20.00. 3. Same scenario but failure to purchase a parking permit thus take your chances parking in the lots the fine would. 1. First ticket waived. 2. The second and subsequent tickets would be \$50.00. Salary increases along with operation cost increases make it necessary to ask for an increase in the bi-annual budget years in order to help maintain our current level of service. Staff in these areas cannot be reduced and still provide adequate police services to ensure the safety of the campus community.

Additionally, we seek a Course Fee Increase of \$5/credit due to changes in Adobe software licensing. We will need to purchase 12 licenses annually at a cost of \$2,040.
