9	Whereas, The University of Montana is currently experiencing a drop in enrollment;

11	Whereas, The Associated Students of the University of Montana (ASUM) is experiencing		
12	significant operational budget shortfalls, expected to continue in Fiscal Year 2017;		
13	Whenever, during hudgeting for Figer Ver 2016 the ASUM Senate with draw funding from		
14	Whereas, during budgeting for Fiscal Year 2016, the ASUM Senate withdrew funding from		
15	Zero-Based Carryover funds, from its Employee Contingency Fund, and from its healthcare		
16 17	savings in order to rectify an executive accounting error;		
17	Whereas, ASUM's agencies have experienced cuts of approximately 20% in the last three (3)		
18 19	fiscal years in order to account for decreasing enrollment;		
20	insear years in order to decount for decreasing emonitent,		
20	Whereas, cuts to these programs have significantly reduced their ability to serve the student		
22	population at UM;

24	Whereas, these programs have experienced increased awareness and use of services despite		
25	dropping enrollment;

27	Whereas, the services provided by ASUM agencies such as Child Care, Legal, Transportation,		
28	Sustainability, Productions, Off-Campus Renter Center, and more, significantly impact student		
29	recruitment, retention, and success;

31	Whereas, the ASUM Activity Fee has increased twice since 2012;		
32			
33	Whereas, these increases came in the amount of \$6 in 2012, which is reserved solely for ASUM		
34	recognized student groups, and in the amount of \$3 in 2015 to establish an infant care center and		
35	a scholarship fund for student research;
