What

The Management Information Systems faculty in the College of Business propose a graduate certificate in Cybersecurity Management. This certificate is designed to align with the Cyber Defense knowledge units developed by the National Security Agency/Department of Homeland Security for information assurance. Students will gain skills in programming; networking technology and protocols; databases and analytics; probability and statistics; policy, legal, ethics, and compliance; cybersecurity fundamentals and practices; and cybersecurity management and planning. The Cybersecurity Management Certificate focuses more on the management issues than the technical issues in cybersecurity

Why

The purpose of this graduate certificate in Cybersecurity Management is provide graduate students with technical and management skills in the area of cybersecurity. Expertise in cybersecurity is an important focus for MIS and graduate business students. The MIS Advisory Board has members that work in the cybersecurity field for KPMG, PwC, Moss Adams, and LMG Security. These companies have stressed that finding employees with skills in the cybersecurity area is one of their top priorities and they have immediate openings for students that receive a certificate in Cybersecurity Management. These companies provide consulting services for other businesses and organizations to help them comply with federal and state regulations, develop policies and procedures to increase security to meet business demands, and provide services to handle security breaches when they occur.

Resources

The leading methodologies for cybersecurity have been developed by the NSA/DHS Center of Academic Excellence in Information Assurance. This proposal addresses all of the Center of Academic Excellence (CAE) knowledge units with existing course offerings and does not require any new courses.

Relationship to similar MUS programs

Missoula College offers a professional certificate in Cybersecurity and the MIS Department has collaborated with them to allow a pathway for MIS students to receive the Missoula College Cybersecurity Professional Certificate. Unfortunately, graduate students cannot receive this certificate and count the courses toward their graduate degree because it is an undergraduate certificate, so this graduate certificate will also be beneficial. Other institutions in the MUS are planning to offer cybersecurity certificates as well, but not at the graduate level.

The Division Chair for Trades contacted all five students enrolled in second year courses in the program. There is no impact on this group of students. Calls were made to ensure the students understood the situation and their ability to complete the program during the 2018-2019 academic year. Letters were sent to those students we were unable to reach by phone.

There were two new student enrolled in the first year courses for this program. The Director of Admissions and Records contacted the students, and discussed options for moving into another program at Helena College or having the application fee refunded. One student has made the decision to move into another program at the college; the other is considering his options for either another program or the possibility of another college.

There were also applicants to the program for the 2018-2019 year, not yet registered for classes. These prospective students were also contacted by the Director of Admissions and Records. Only one application for the program was recent. Based on a phone conversation, this student will be moving into another program at the college. The prospective students who applied more than six months ago, with no further contact to the school, were sent a letter explaining the situation.

One student who began enrollment in the program during the 2017-2018 year was attempting to retake a course that was not successfully completed during his first attempt. He met with the Division Chair for Trades and the Associate Dean of Academic and Student Affairs to discuss options, and has decided to enroll in another trade program at Helena College.
