Student in the Arts



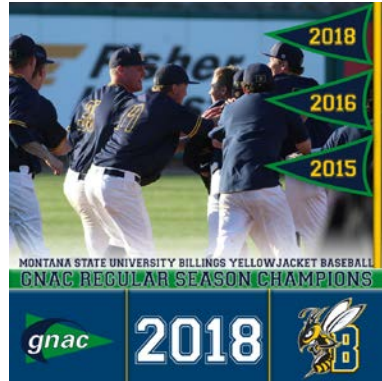
Terri Porta worked most of her summer on 5,000 sq. ft. mural in downtown Billings that unfolds moments in the city's history dating back to the 1870's.
