The Student Health Center maintains all immunization records and provides the local administrative support for the Student Health Insurance program.
SU Fee		The Student Union Use Fee funds the personnel, programs, staff, maintenance, equipment, utilities and deferred maintenance projects in the Student Union Building. The SUB was remo 1986. The SUB serves as the host location for many public events, and funding is needed to maintain the facility in a manner that meets the expectations of students and guests.
Equipment Fee		The Equipment Fee provides funds to purchase new equipment and for the replacement of used or out-of-date equipment utilized in academic buildings and classrooms. This may includ furniture, lab equipment, audio-visual equipment, etc.

This fee is the posture of funding for the entire program to include staffing, referees for intramural sports, lifeguards, partial support for fitness center, check-in staff at the desk, equipment, and other of expenses.
Technology Replacement Fee	123-101-R0504	The Technology Replacement Fee is designed to fund the Administrative Information System (AIS), campus infrastructure, and supporting computing environment. This fee provides the comprehensive technology platform upon which all students, faculty, and staff conduct the business of the university.

**Justification:** The Department of Athletics is requesting an approval of a new non-mandatory fee. MSUB Athletics requires all student-athletes to have maintain a primary health insurance prior to participation. MSUB Athletics offers a secondary insurance policy with a \$4,000 deductible. Occasionally, student-athletes report to MSUB with no primary insurance or a primary insurance that does not cover them in the state of Montana. In these cases, our athletic trainers advise the student-athlete to purchase a primary policy available to them through the NCAA. From time to time, student-athletes who need this coverage do not have the cash up front to make this purchase (\$795 for FY19). Therefore, MSUB Athletics requests the ability to purchase the insurance for the student-athlete upfront, and then in turn charge the student's account for the cost of the primary insurance coverage. This will ease the burden on the student, and allow them to use financial aid or other scholarship to help assist with this cost. Additionally, this new non-mandatory fee for student-athletes will assist the Department of Athletics with keeping secondary insurance costs and claims low and at a minimum.
