## **REPORT:**

I'm pleased to report that total full-time equivalent (FTE) enrollment at Dawson has increased by 13% this year and full-time headcount has increased 14.4%. Total headcount is 445, up from 388 at the same time last year. Dawson also reported 298 FTEs and 214 full-time students, compared to 263 FTEs and 187 full-time students in Fall 2018. This year's student body is 58% female and 42% male and includes students from seven countries, 14 states, and 35 counties in Montana.

Dawson Community College's partnership with The American Campus in Mauritius was highlighted in the October 22, 2019 issue of CCID (Community Colleges for International Development) XCHANGE Newsletter (<u>https://www.ccidinc.org/</u>). Although still new, this partnership continues to experience growing success and enrollment.

At the ACCT Leadership Congress in October, I, along with other members of AACC's Commission on Small and Rural Colleges, participated in a panel presentation aimed at helping community college trustees hire and onboard successful CEOs. The presentation, *"Find the Right Fit: Hiring and Onboarding Presidents in Small and Rural Colleges,"* discussed the unique skillset, demeanor, and perspective required of CEOs to effectively lead in a rural environment.

The Dawson Promise continues to gain state and national attention. Vice President of Advancement and Human Resources, Leslie Weldon, recently presented the Dawson Promise program to an audience at the CASE Community College Advancement Conference, and is collaborating with the Montana Continuum of Care and the National Center on Homeless Education.

DCC's Guest Lecture series continued in October with a presentation by Dr. Laura Beth VanderVeur. "The Impact of Generations on Societal Institutions," explored America's generations from the 1900's to the 2010's, and the unique characteristics and life events that have forcefully shaped mindsets, habits, and views and has impacted institutions in society, from the government to community groups to faithbased groups to social media.

Financial aid director, Justin Beach, led Financial Aid 101 presentations at a number of area high schools to help parents and students navigate the FAFSA process and answer their questions about financial aid.
