# **ASUM Election Results Report**

Spring 2020

## I. Summary

The following election results were collected between April  $22^{nd}$  at 12:01am to April  $23^{rd}$  at 8:00pm through an election web application developed by Student Affairs Information Technology (SAIT). The total number of participants was 1,347 of the total student population of 10,246 – based on the University of Montana 2020 Spring Census. For resolutions to pass the student participation rate in the election must meet the threshold of 12%. This was met with a total participation rate of 13.15%
