Spring Semester

As we move forward through the coronavirus pandemic, DCC continues to work with the county's health department and is following local, state, and federal guidelines. Currently, spring semester will begin face to face and end one week early with the removal of spring break. <u>Advising</u>

Academic Advising survey of students and advisors was conducted:

- 93% of the student respondents were "Satisfied" or "Very Satisfied" with their Academic Advising experience on Advisee Day.
- Of 10 advisor respondents 8 "Agreed" or "Strongly Agreed" that Advisee Day went Smoothly.

<u>Athletics</u>

Dawson County Health approved our spectator plan for indoor events (basketball/volleyball) to include 20% capacity. It includes 75 students, 25 faculty/staff, 50 Bucs Club members and 50 general admission for sale (they will be sold on a first come/first serve basis where fans will have to reserve in advance).

Workforce Development

DCC was awarded a \$140,000 School Aged Grant, "After School Program." We have been offering tutoring, STEM activities, Gaming, Music camps, Animal Science camps, Welding activities and so much more. This has been a big help to school aged children and families throughout our community.
