[CJ Degree Considered Most Affordable in the West](#) - Intelligent.com evaluated all of the probation officer degree programs in the country and rated MSU-Northern's Criminal Justice degree 39th overall based on flexibility, faculty, course strength, cost, and reputation. They rated it the most affordable degree in the west.

[Northern Helps Design School](#) - Multi-millionaire, Norm Asbjornson, donated the funds for Winifred, Montana, to build a new high-tech K-12 school. The designers of the building have tapped into the faculty at Northern's College of Technical Sciences for recommendations on how to design the tech parts of the school.

[SKILLSUSA](#) - The 2021 State Leadership and Skills Conference for SkillsUSA Montana was held all across the state and was a combination of hands-on and virtual events. Due to the Covid-19 restrictions, the event was not able to take place at MSU-Northern, but Northern helped judge and run the event.
