Concurrent Enrollment

 Taught by qualified high school teacher (or licensed college faculty)

Delivered in HS classroom

Dual Enrollment

High school students taking college courses

Early College

- Taught by college faculty
- Delivered on college campus and/or online





What the data tells us

Most students take DE through Concurrent Enrollment


DE students in larger schools & urban areas more commonly take DE in their schools

Early College students in larger schools & urban areas take DE more on campus than online

DE students in smaller schools & rural areas more commonly take DE online

DE students in the smallest schools take DE more online than in person Smaller schools are less likely than larger schools to offer Concurrent Enrollment courses
