### **Program Features**


- Rural Placements
- Living wage stipends
- 3 year teaching commitment after completion
- New teacher mentoring
- Remote professional learning opportunities
- Professional development for school leaders





#### **Teacher placements:**

- Cohort 1 (2020-21)
- 18 enrolled; 16 graduated; 14 employed
- Cohort 2 (2021-22)
- 20 enrolled; 15 active in program



#### Mentoring new rural teachers:

- >100 teachers volunteered to be mentors
- 20 mentors trained
- 14 matched to new teacher grade and content


