


HOW RARELY OR OFTEN DID YOU:

The value of an external evaluation:

- Strong research design
- Reliable estimates of program impacts and costs
- Partnership to answer the questions that matter to you
- **Dissemination** of findings locally and nationally

- 1,000 Montana




