Program Overview

- Pell Grants were reinstated to incarcerated individuals in 2015
 - 2016, 2020, 2022 cohorts for Experimental Pilot
 - 9,000 students
 - 200 institutions
 - 7,000 credentials
- Active Sites Represent Partnership
 - Higher Education Institution
 - Correctional Facility



Approved Educational Programs and Sites

- Helena College – Montana State Prison, Certificate in Automotive Technology
- Great Falls College – Crossroads Correctional Facility, Office Management and Support
- Dawson Community College – Dawson Correctional Facility, Montana Women’s Prison, Licensed Addiction Counseling
- MSU – Billings – Montana Women’s Prison, Montana State Prison, Associates of





Mission-Driven

- Student Access
 - Nationally, 2% of incarcerated individuals have postsecondary degrees
- Completion/Attainment
- Workforce Development
 - By 2027, 70% of jobs will require postsecondary training and education beyond high school
 - 95% of incarcerated students will re-enter their communities



Next Steps for SCP and System Role

- Expansion of Pell in 2023 Award Year
- Changes to the FAFSA for 2023 Award Year
- Alignment/Audit of policies and processes that impact our incarcerated students
 - Student Fees
 - Enrollment processes
 - Cost structures
- Support Data Collection for quality metrics
- Partner with Corrections and Campuses to create community advisory groups

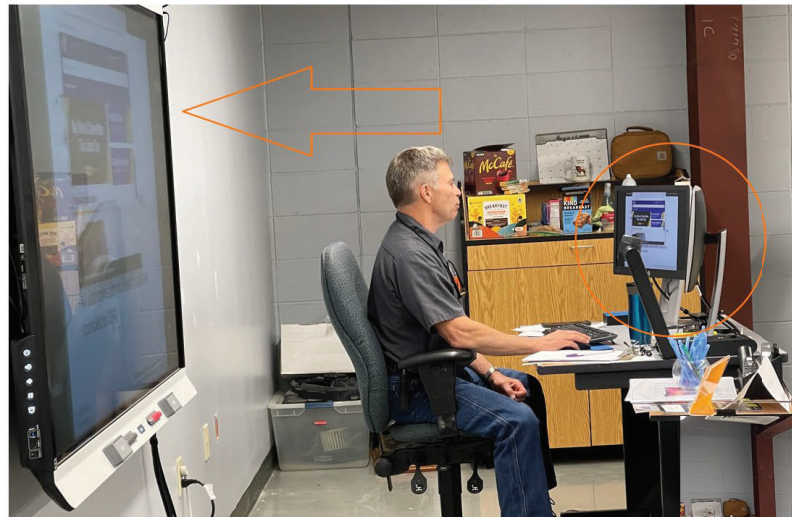
Our process

- Decision to apply to participate
 - Tour and conversations with DOC to determine fit
 - Automotive Advisory Board support
- Applied specifically for one program, limited participation
 - Students selected by DOC
 - Must be able to complete the one-year program prior to release
 - CAS provides skills for entering workforce and/or stacks to AAS
- MSP additional location for Helena College
 - Our students = same experience



Our instructional model

Attend automotive lecture classes with HC instructor through Smart technology and Lab work with DOC instructor in Deer Lodge



- No projector, Smartboard is computer
- Everyone joined through Teams
- Class recorded and posted in Moodle
- Students in MSP classroom on Jerry's screen
- Document camera for hands-on demos





Our instructional model

- Faculty partnership
- General Education courses with existing DOC teachers – HC Adjuncts
 - Adjunct instructors working with HC Faculty
 - Allows for face-to-face instruction
- Tutoring support through Teams



Our support services

- Financial aid visit for FAFSA
- Application assistance
- New student orientation
- Advisor meetings through Teams
- Student wellness, career information, financial literacy over the year
- Graduation ceremony planned



Our plans

- Learn from this year - refine the process
- Continue with CAS in Automotive – 10 students/year
- 2023-2024 add CAS in Diesel Technology – 10 students/year
- 2024-2025 add CAS in Industrial Welding – 10 students/year
- Explore AA/AS options
