Subject: Campus Report for the January 2023 Board of Regents Meeting

Community Education Center

• Helena College will be hosting **St. Peter's Health** for its upcoming Health Awareness Program and will be open to the Helena community.

- The **Small Business Development Center** (SBDC), hosted at Helena College, allocated \$195,858 in total funds since the fall of 2020 to assist local area businesses in direct training, resources, and assistance during COVID through the CARES Act funding.
- In partnership with **Opportunity Bank**, the pilot *Online Fundamentals of Banking Course*, delivered to support the employment and training needs of this major industry sector was successful. Another course will be offered in spring 2023 to meet demand.
- The Community Education Center offered the following non-credit courses during the fall: Medical Coding & Billing, Pharmacy Technician, Microsoft Programs, Photoshop, Computer Skills, Grant Writing, Sign Language, Spanish, Leadership Certification Training, Veterinarian Assistant Certification, and Optician Certification Training.
- The **Hybrid-Electric Vehicle Summit** is scheduled for January 9, 2023, at the Airport Campus with Automotive Instructor Jerry Stewart. This training was created using GEER funding to support continuing education needs of this industry.
- The fall **CDL Program** ended with a 100% pass rate and success rate on the testing. Great job for our instructor **Mark Meyer** in having such a high success rate in each of our cohorts.
 - o The next CDL class will start on February 27, 2023.
 - o Hiring a second instructor to utilize the First Spring Course as a training opportunity.
 - o Working with the Montana Department of Transportation to coordinate CDL testing services in conjunction with Jones Brother's Trucking out of Missoula and the Montana Contractor's Association Local 400 Union in Helena.
- The **Testing Center** is working to become an accredited and nationally recognized center. The full accreditation will be a year-long process and is expected to be completed in the spring of 2024.
- The Community Education Center was approached by the **Historical Society** to bring their very popular seminar series to Helena College while their new facility is being completed.


General Education

• Montana's Future at Work grant to promote our ECP 130 class (EMT) is producing some great results. Six high school students are registered for the class.

MT 10

- The MT10 2022 Cohort just finished up their First Year Experience class with a written personal narrative.
- MT10 students at Helena College were retained at a significantly higher rate (66%) compared to the full entering cohort and show a 13% increase over the 2021 MT10 cohort.

Nursing

- The **Nurse Pinning Ceremony** was held Friday, December 16, 2022, for 14 RN nurse graduates and 8 LPN graduates (4 from our expanded program at Bitterroot College).
- Audio-visual recording and debriefing equipment will be installed in February 2023 in DON 109, the
 dedicated Simulation lab. The equipment allows the students and faculty to record the simulations and skills
 practice and review the results to improve student responses and interventions in the simulated sessions.
- New clinical partnerships were formed in the fall of 2022 with Bitterroot Health in Hamilton, Missoula
 Health and Rehabilitation, the Living Centre in Stevensville, and the Florence-Carlton School District in
 Florence, Montana. The partnerships helped provide clinical nursing experiences for our LPN students in the
 Bitterroot Valley.
