John Shaffner (BFA '74) is the most celebrated and influential production designer in recent history. His letters of support from producers, actors and designers all attest to the unparalleled quality of his work and to his generous and humble nature. His curriculum vitae speaks to the overwhelming scale of his work, documenting hundreds of television series, award shows, music events, talk shows, live specials and theatre designs. He has been recognized by his colleagues and the television industry repeatedly with over 70 award nominations, winning several Emmys and Art Director Awards over his career. In short, his work is brilliant, imaginative and innovative; it has set the standard for television and live entertainment specials for generations.

John easily deserves to be recognized with the honorary degree of Doctor of Humane Letters (L.H.D.) from the University of Montana based simply on his numerous awards and recognitions, his brilliant and lengthy career, and the beautiful designs with which he has graced our stages and screens over these many decades. For as long as we have known him, John has answered our calls literally and figuratively. He has designed scenery for Montana Repertory Theatre's national tours (often refusing his design fees). He has made himself available for our students both while they are in school and after they graduate. He has mentored students, colleagues and aspiring designers throughout his career, helping countless young professionals find their way in the entertainment world. He is always willing to teach workshops for the School of Theatre and Dance, has helped recruit for our program and has served on the College of the Arts and Media's Advisory Council for many years.

John is a staunch advocate for the School of Theatre and Dance and the University of Montana. His roots are in this community and he is a proud and loyal supporter of our work, our faculty/staff and our students. We are so very proud to include John Shaffner in the vibrant history of this program in this deeply significant way; it demonstrates we will forever be appreciative of all the time and talents he has given to our School.

Dear Mr. Monsos,

I am writing this letter in support of John Shaffner receiving an honorary doctorate for his illustrious career in the television arts. I can't think of anyone more deserving of such an honor. "Hollywood" lost a legend in production design when John decided to retire.

I have worked with John several times over the last couple of decades and was proud to produce his last television pilot before his retirement. We met with several production designers on the pilot and by the end of the meeting, it was clearly John's show. His approach to the meeting was far different from any of the other production designers that we met with that day. John read the script with an eye toward the characters and presented set design ideas while talking about the characters and not necessarily the sets. I'm not sure if I am conveying my thoughts properly but the set design discussion was a reflection of John's interpretation of who he thought the characters were. None of the others meeting that day approached the presentation in such a way.

The quality of John's work is evidenced by his body of work. His beautiful designs span decades and can be seen in Friends, The Drew Carey Show, Two And A Half Men, Dharma & Greg, 'Til Death, Mike & Molly, The Big Bang Theory, Mom, Bob Heart Abishola, and The Conners to name a few. Not to mention, there are countless television pilots that he designed that never made it on the air. I don't think there is another production designer that has designed sets for as many episodes of television as John.

He designed beautiful sets but more importantly he is a wonderful person to collaborate with and to learn from. He treated his teams with respect and kindness. He handled the daily script changes with a positive attitude and no noticeable stress. There was nothing that a writer could throw at John that he couldn't handle with ease.

He is a mentor to many.

I started working with John during his meteoric rise to production design stardom. Although John managed numerous Art Departments, I was one of the few and closest designers that worked side-by-side, daily, with John over the last twenty-five years.

John's work set the standard for multi-camera and variety production design. A winner of eight (8) Emmy awards and seventy (70) overall nominations from the most reputable organizations, including the Television Academy and the Art Director's Guild (ADG), says it all. Plus, having served diligently in the ADG union on behalf of its members, and ultimately as President and Chairman of the Television Academy, itself are indicative of his expertise, contributions, and recognition, beyond the multitude of positive recommendations from his peers. Not to mention, he coined the fabulous name of the hit 80's show "Star Search" chose the iconic floral tropical couch from the Golden Girls, and placed the golden picture frame around the apartment door's peephole on Friends.

From an early age, John was more than adept at design, he embraced it and thrived in a hard and competitive environment. He has captained the Art Departments of numerous hit shows, including the number one shows on television for their respective eras, including Friends, Two and a Half Men, and the Big Bang Theory. Also, in the variety world, John and his partner Joe were always working at the pinnacle level, having designed the Emmys, American Music Awards, The Republican National Convention, and even David Copperfield's amazing shows.

As an employer, John always strove to bring in new Production Assistants so as to teach the craft. He opened his office, his studio, his home, and his heart to young designers. He constantly volunteered as an alumnus and always found a way to give back.

Fittingly, I once asked John about eligibility for the Hollywood Boulevard Walk of Fame, that is, getting his own sidewalk star. It turns out that you have to pay \$25,000 for that. His response, he would rather pay that money to a school for scholarship for young designers than promote his own ego. In short John is an amazing man.

John nurtured and molded me into the Set Designer, then Art Director, now Production Designer that I am today. He took me under his wing, taught me his craft, and I am humbly grateful. Thank you for allowing me to say that no one is more deserving for this great honor than John.

He has spent time outside of his production design work sitting on the Board of the Academy of Television Arts and Sciences as well as acting as Governor of ATAS. He was served as a Chairman for the Art Directors Guild of Local 800. He dedicates time mentoring and teaching interns and assistant designers who have grown into successful and talented art directors now working in our industry. I've recently worked with a former mentee on one of our Netflix series and John's teachings clearly shown through this art director's work which contributed to the show's success.

My admiration for John Shaffner runs deep due to his grace and partnership. Like most people who cross his path, I have learned much from John beyond his design talent. He sets a wonderful example of teamwork and integrity. He inspires others to lead with humility and to give back to our community. His impact on our entire television industry is immeasurable. I am honored to have collaborated with him for several years of his long and esteemed career.
