## American Indian Student Success



- American Indian student enrollment has grown by nearly 16% since 2016
- Fall 2020-21 and 2021-22 marked the two highest years for American Indian student retention in the MUS
- American Indian student completions grew significantly in the 2021-22 academic year
  - Increases at every level (certificates, associates, bachelors, masters and doctoral)
- Next Steps: New AIMA Recommendations and Action Plans

- Strong partnerships with Educator Prep 2 + 2 models (LBHC and BCC with UMW)
- Strong partnership with BCC on Grow Your Own Educator Program (NEET)
