	Science degree in Earth Science; Montana State University-Bozeman.

116-2016+R0702 Request to extend its existing Bachelor of Science in Nursing to Kalispell in

cooperation with Flathead Valley Community College, Kalispell Regional Hospital and North Valley Hospital (Whitefish, MT). This program will serve cohorts of students by offering all junior and senior level nursing courses in the Flathead Valley beginning January 2003. The partnership leading to degree delivery was

formed in May 2000. Montana State University-Bozeman.

116-2851+R0702 Request to change the Department of Related Instruction to the Department of

Arts and Sciences; Montana State University-Great Falls, College of Technology.

116-2852+R0702 Request to change the Department of Allied Health to the Department of Health

Sciences; Montana State University-Great Falls, College of Technology.

University of Montana:

116-1502+R0702 Request from Montana Tech to offer the Master of Science in Industrial Hygiene

via online delivery. The degree will be one of only three distance delivery masters I.H. programs in the entire United States. The program started in 1983 and has

graduated approximately 90 graduate students.

116-1503A+R0702 Request to convert the current Associate of Science in Nursing (ASN) degree

"Bridge Program" to a traditional 72-Credit ASN model: Montana Tech of The

University of Montana.

In addition, the University of Montana-Missoula gives notice that two programs in the College of Technology have been placed on moratorium status: AAS in Medical Laboratory Assisting and the AAS in Barbering. Both programs have had low enrollments and limited employment opportunities for graduates.
