Enactment

The Montana Rural Physician Incentive Program, authorized by the 1991 Montana Legislature and amended by the 1997 Montana Legislature, was established to encourage primary care physicians to practice in medically underserved areas of rural Montana.

Towards this end, the Rural Physician Incentive Trust Fund was established to facilitate the payment of the qualified educational debts of physicians who practice in areas of the state that are medically underserved and that demonstrate the need for assistance in physician recruitment and retention. Annual fees assessed to all Montana WICHE and WWAMI medical students fund this trust.

Collection of funds from WICHE and WWAMI medical students began in the Fall of 1992. Disbursement of funds for loan repayment began in 1993.

Qualified Locations

Eligible locations qualifying for service awards are communities of rural Montana that have experienced difficulty in attracting and maintaining enough physicians to serve their population. In general, such communities have populations of less than 8,000 and hospitals with less than 50 beds. The United States government has designated many of these areas as health professional shortage areas (HPSA's). Hospitals and other community organizations in these areas must verify their inability to recruit and retain sufficient numbers of physicians.

Selection/Approval Process

Applications are submitted jointly by a physician and an organization or institution (i.e., a hospital, clinic or nursing home) located in the community in which the physician wishes to practice. An advisory committee that is appointed by the Commissioner of Higher Education reviews prospective applications for program eligibility and prioritizes them for participation based on community physician needs. Applications recommended for program participation are then submitted to the Board of Regents for approval based upon the availability of funds. Funding priority is given to WICHE and WWAMI graduates who contributed to the trust fund.

Benefits

Current program benefits allow repayment of up to \$45,000 in total toward the qualified medical education loans of participating physicians over a one-to five-year period of service in a location of physician need. Graduated payments are disbursed directly to verified lending institutions in six-month increments over the physician's designated service period.

Participation Status

Since the inception of the program in 1993, 85 applications have been submitted for consideration of which 72 have been approved, and 2 are currently pending review/approval. The following table illustrates the status of all applications.
