Similar states have achieved licensing fees 20-40% lower than the MUS by moving to a single provider.




A single LMS can help make academic collaborations, including course sharing and distributed programs, possible and seamless.




Fall 2019 Lower Division Course Offerings

- Course Offerings w/ Sharing








Discipline: Chemistry



Lower-Division Major Requirements






January 2020 travel time to a respiratory therapy offering in Montana


