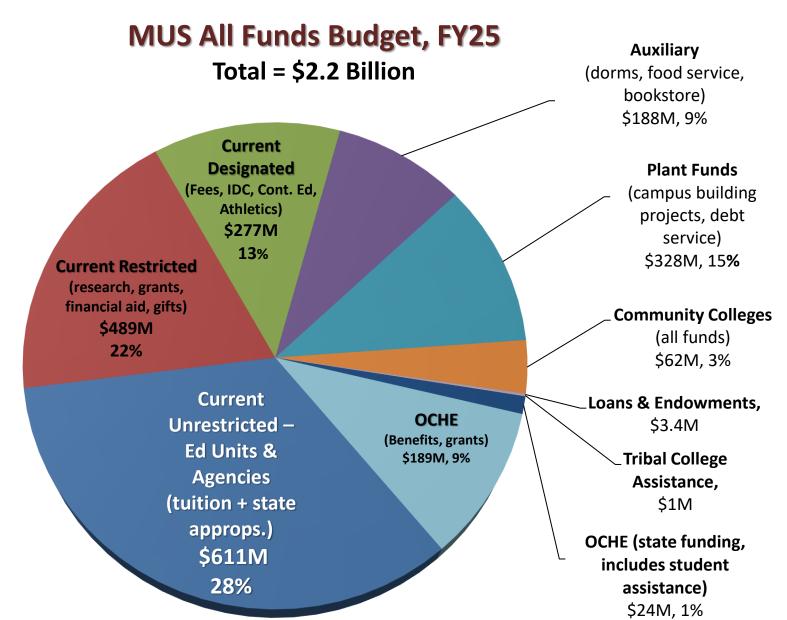

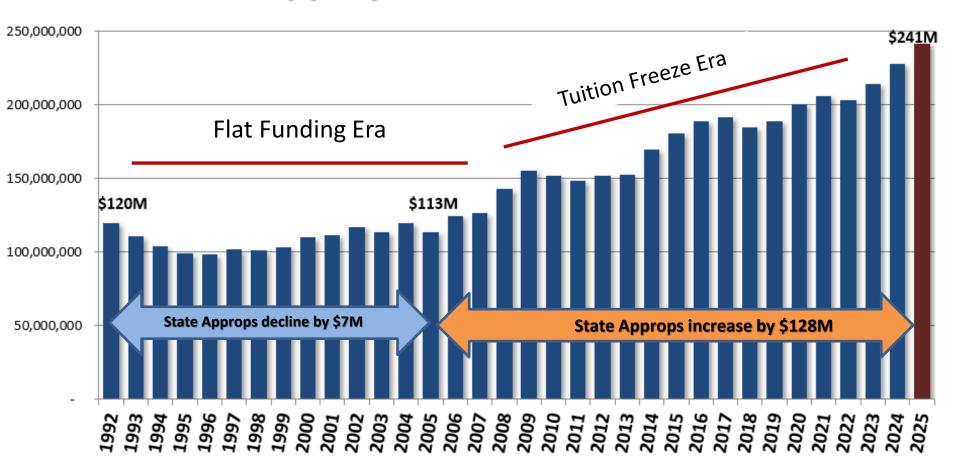

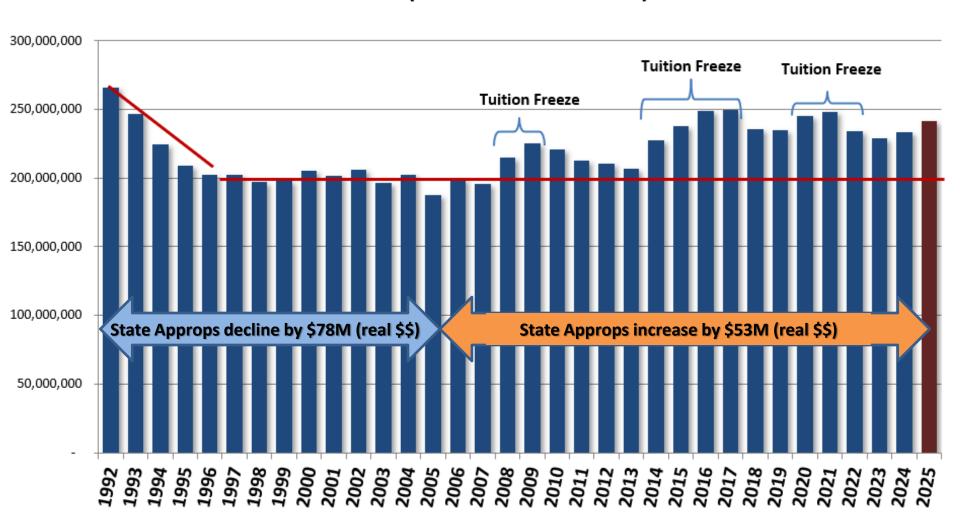
## **State Appropriations – MUS Ed. Units**

(2024 constant dollars)



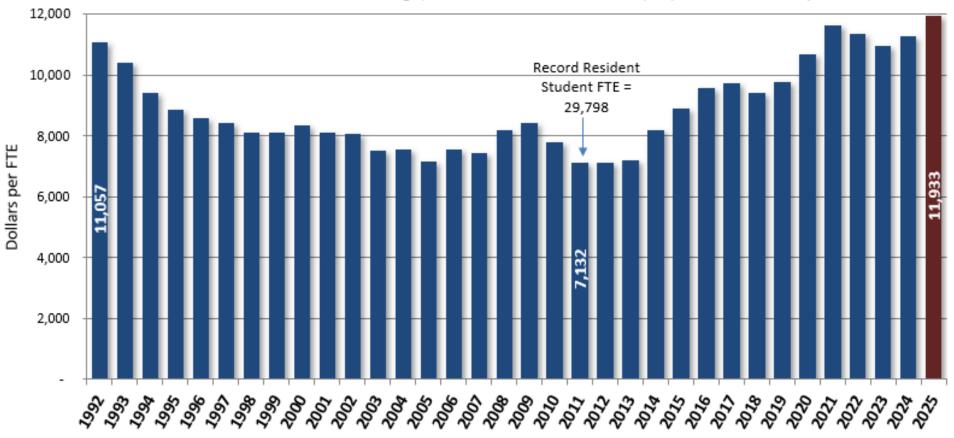
The U-system receives fewer state approps today than it did in 1992 (inflationary adj)

(2024 constant dollars)

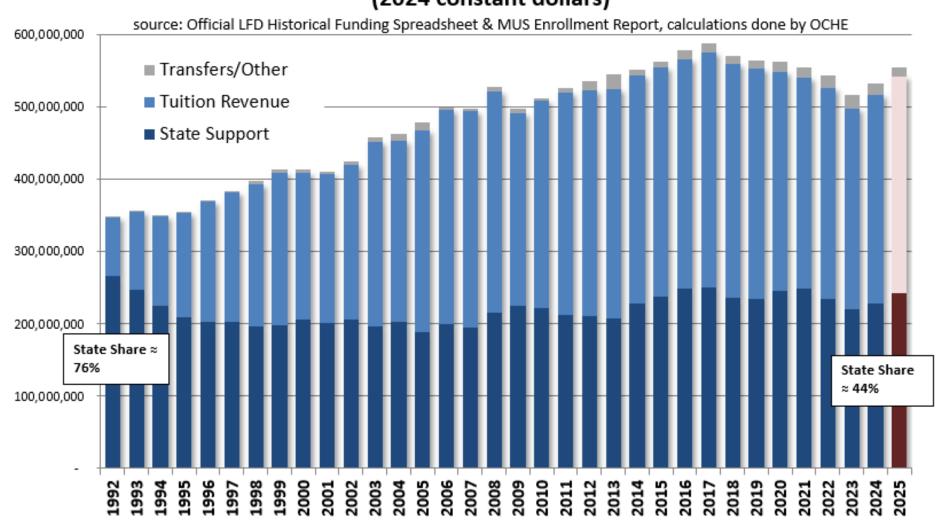

#### **Current Unrestricted Funds - Ed Units Only**

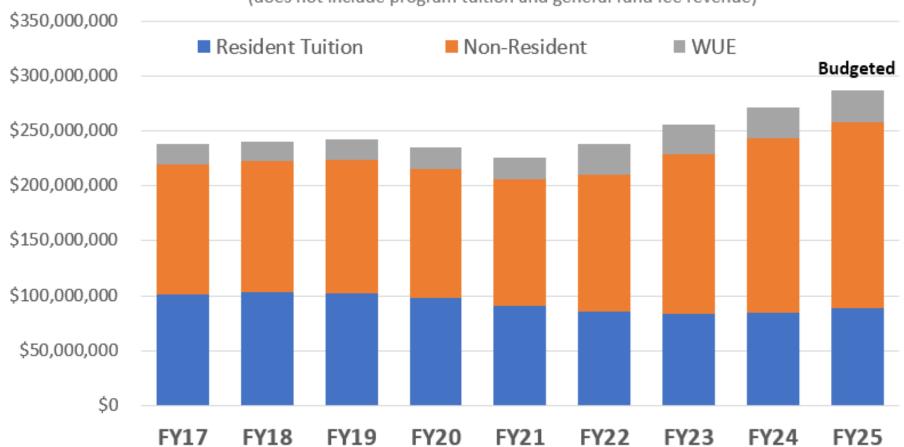

(does not include program tuition and general fund fee revenue)

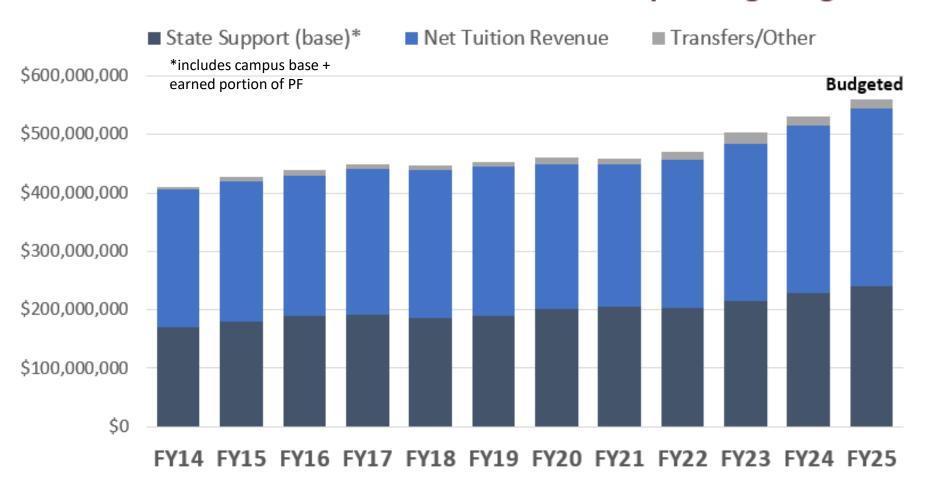


#### **Tuition revenue projected to be up 6%:**

Resident Tuition = +5%, Non-resident = 6%, WUE = 3.3%



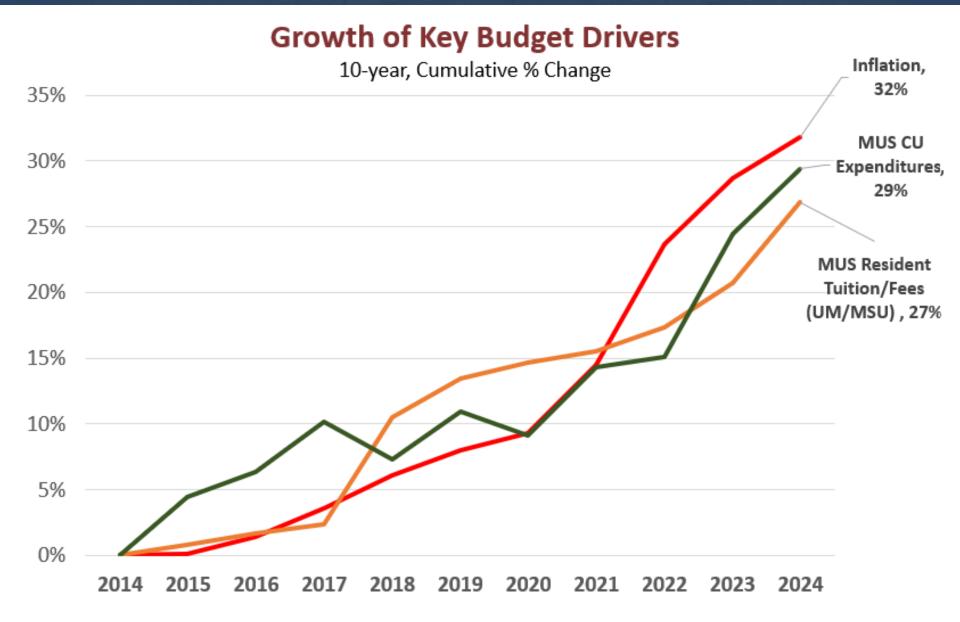
#### **MUS Current Unrestricted Revenue - Operating Budget**



#### **Current Unrestricted Revenue budgeted to increase by \$28M (5%)**

- 1) State Support up \$10M (5%) \*\*present law/pay plan\*\*
- 2) Tuition Revenue up \$16M (6%) \*\*tuition increases + enrollment growth\*\*
- 3) Transfers/Other up \$1.5M \*\*carryover from FY24\*\*



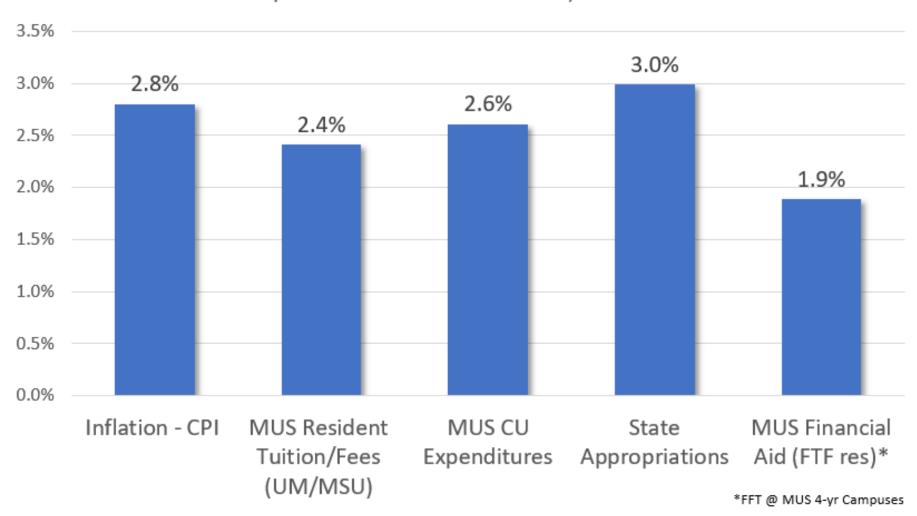


Tuition/Fees and MUS Expenditures have mirrored the growth of inflation.



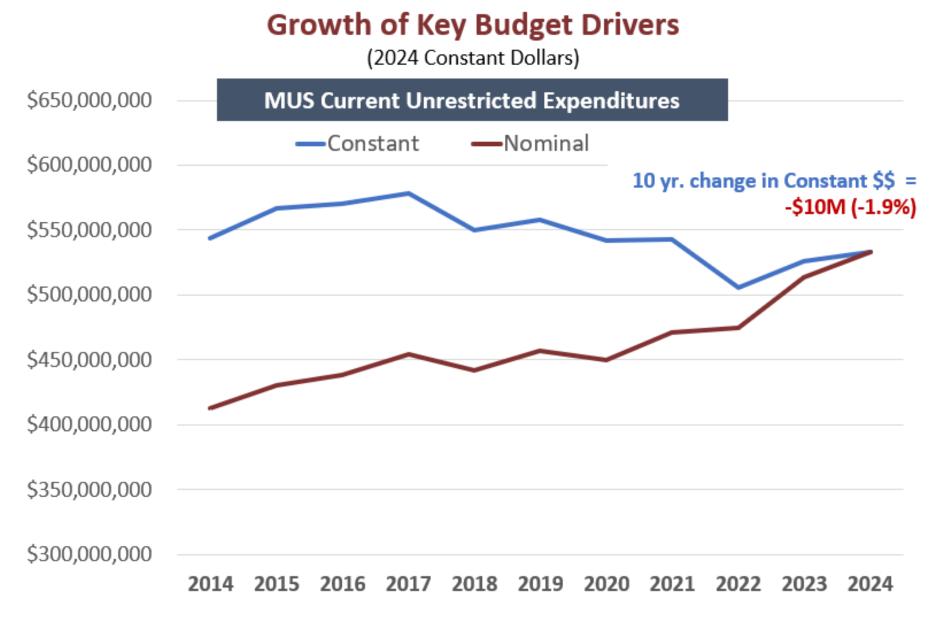
#### **Growth of Key Budget Drivers**

Compounded Annual Growth Rate, FY14 - FY24



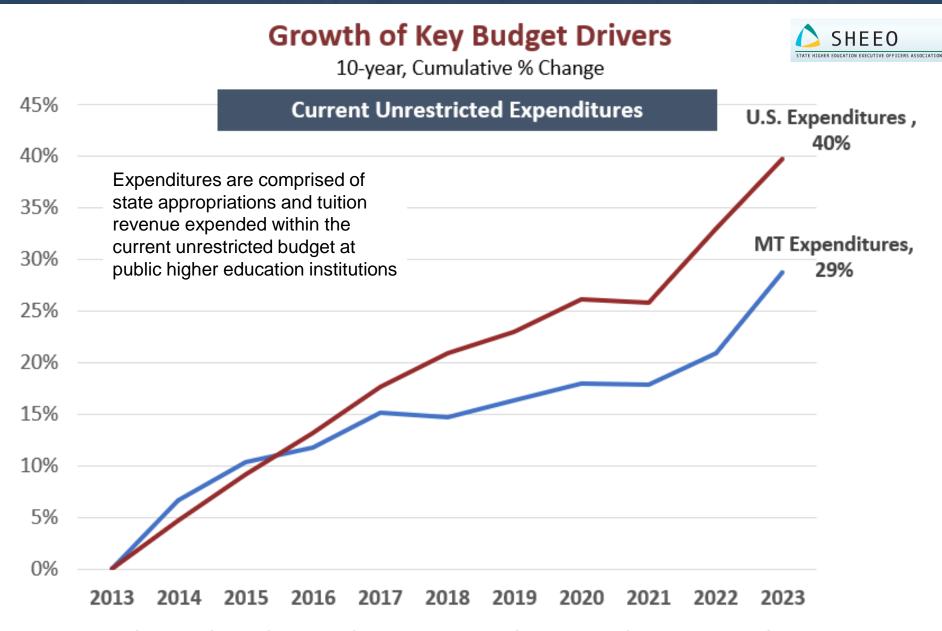
Tuition freezes accelerated State Approps and slowed the growth of tuition/fees.





In constant dollars, MUS expenditures drop by \$10M over the past 10 years.





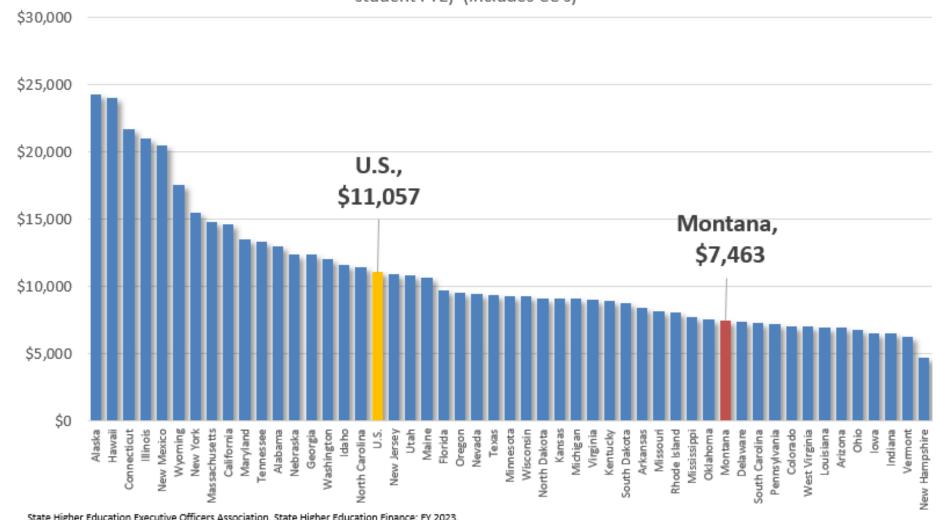
Growth in Higher Ed. expenditures nationwide outpaced increases in the MUS

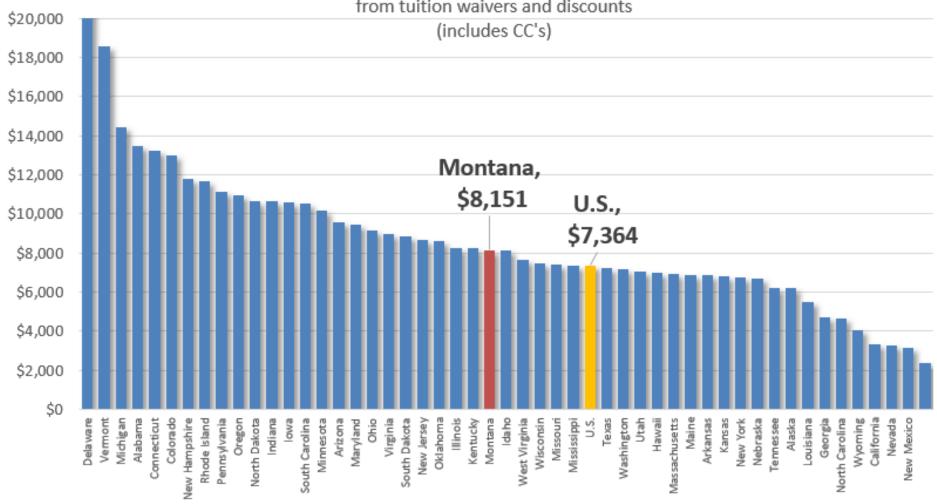

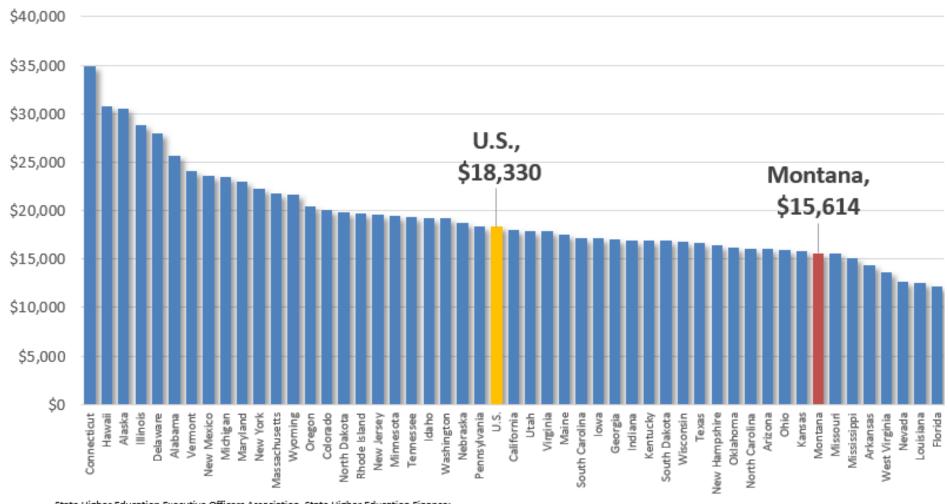
MT is slightly above the national average in the amount of net tuition received per student

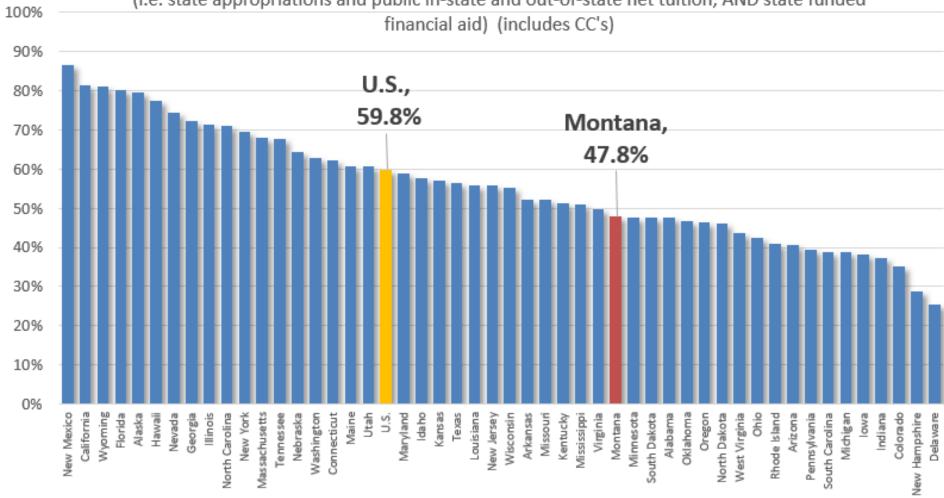

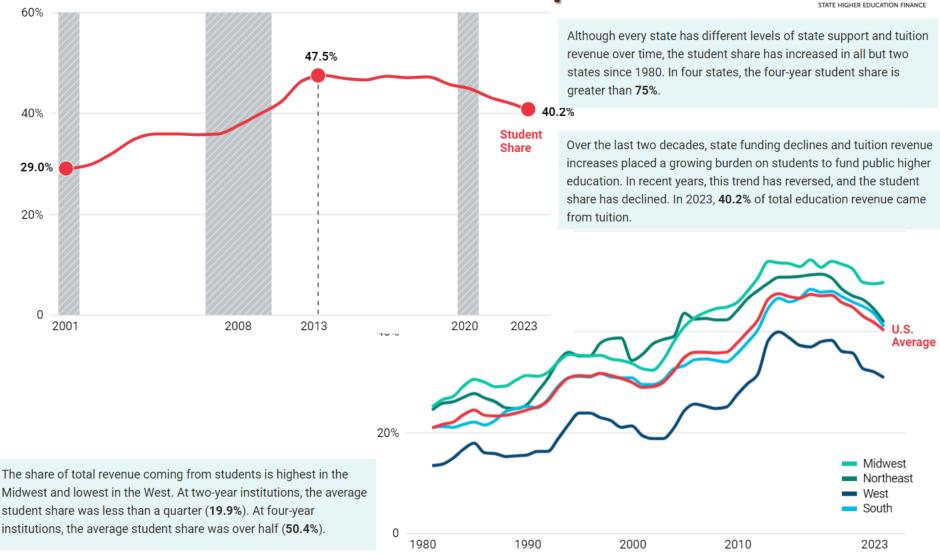

# **Student Share Comparisons**



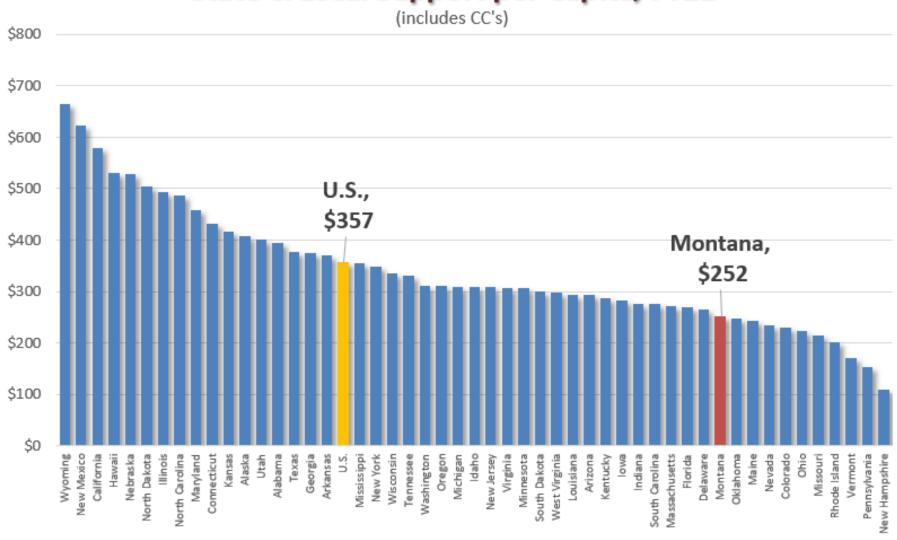

## State & Local Support per Capita, FY22



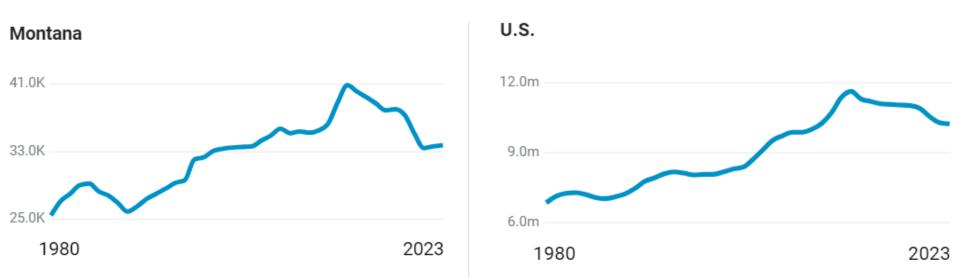

#### MUS enrollment in FY24 increased by 2% (+800 FTE)

#### **National Trends**

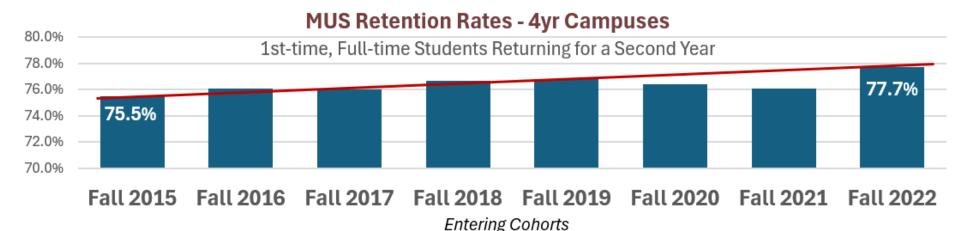
- Nationally, enrollment declined for the 12th straight year.
- Enrollment declined in 25 states between 2022 and 2023.
- Cumulatively, FTE enrollment at public institutions has declined by 6.1% since the start of the COVID-19 pandemic in 2020 and 0.5% in the last year.
- Altogether, FTE enrollment has declined 12% from its peak in 2011.

#### **Enrollment in the MUS has increased each year since 2021**

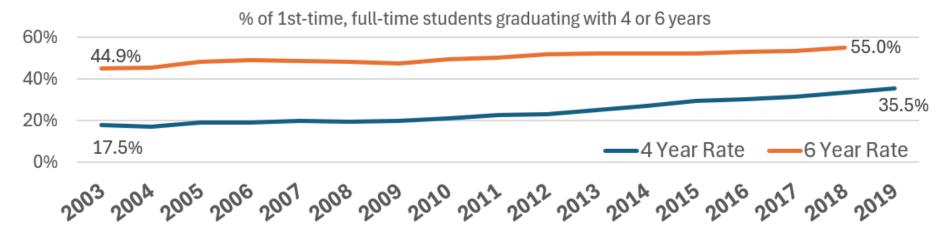

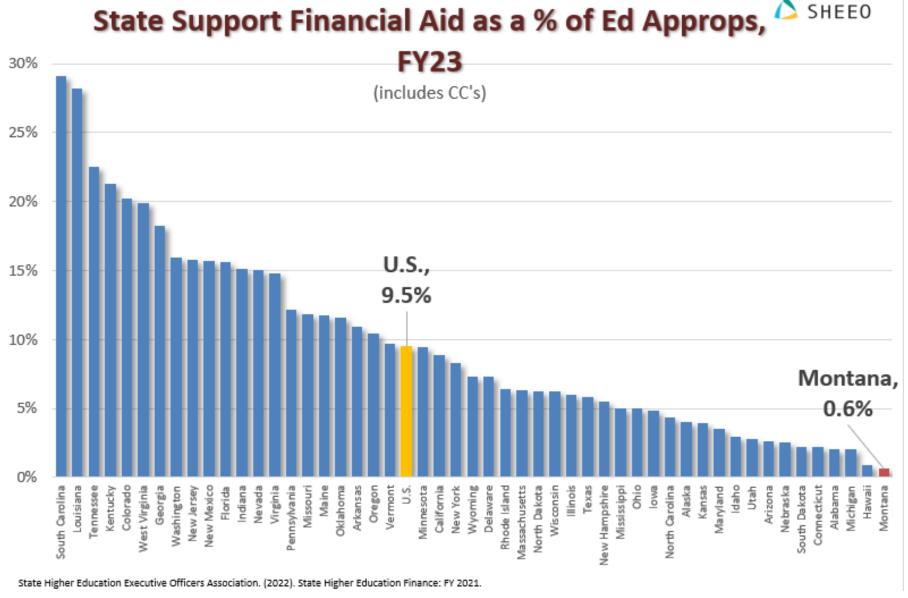






Improved retention has contributed to stable enrollment AND student success!

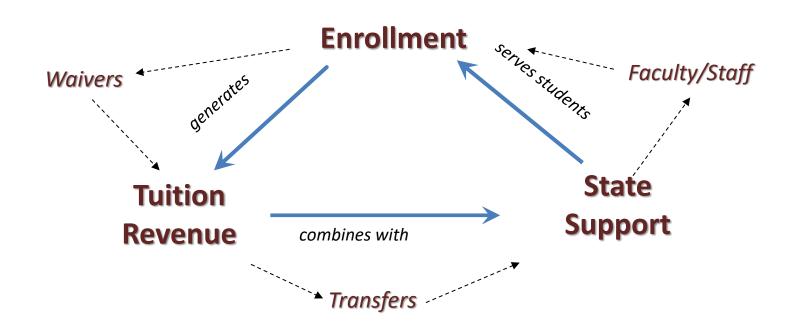

#### **Major Budget Drivers**

- Pay Plan = \$18M and Present Law = \$5M (\$23M budgeted increase)
- Enrollment (Res/Non-res/WUE); projected increase
- Resident/Non-Res tuition increases; increasing tuition revenue
- Enrollment management and financial aid
- Staffing demands

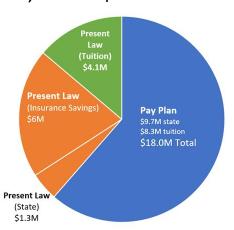




#### **Present Law Increases & Pay Plan, FY25**

- > Pay Plan (4% or \$1.50 per hour, whichever is greater)
  - = \$9.7M state, \$8.3M tuition, total = \$18.0M
- Present Law Adjustment
  - Higher Ed Specific Costs (IT, library, safety, compliance, rent, contracts, maintenance)
  - Other Costs (utilities, compliance/safety)
  - Other Personnel Costs (faculty merit/market, leave payout, retention)
  - = \$1.3M state, \$4M tuition, total =\$5.3M
- Insurance Holiday –\$6M

**TOTAL** = \$29M

Policy 940.13: The MUS must ensure that the average net tuition revenue per non-resident student (not including WUE students) exceeds the average net tuition revenue plus state appropriations per resident student. In other words, net educational revenues per student FTE must be greater for the non-resident student population than the resident student population.

- Waivers per student: 8% budgeted increase, growth of \$200 per student FTE
- Net tuition revenue per student continues to increase, +5% increase FY24 over FY23
- Average Net Revenue per FTE Benchmark: Yes, meets required levels
